



# What is the Energy Efficiency Check Pilot?

The Energy Efficiency (EE) Check pilot project is a demonstration of an innovative approach for supporting energy efficiency retrofits for large buildings and smaller and mid-size industrial facilities. EE Check uses an expert team to provide low-cost, comprehensive support and advice to owners and managers who are embarking on, or considering, energy efficiency upgrades.

The pilot has a limited scope (Calgary and surrounding areas) and timeframe (upgrades to be completed by March 2013). The pilot will be carefully evaluated to assess the opportunity for a province-wide, long-term initiative.

# How does the EE Check Pilot work?

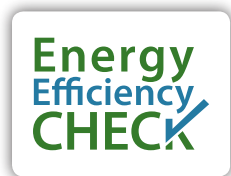
EE Check Pilot is a collaboration between one or more facility owner/managers and the *Energy Action Team*.

The *Energy Action Team* is an independent, non-profit, third-party organization. Team members are experts on energy efficient upgrades with in-depth knowledge of the upgrade industry in Calgary (including assessors, designers, contractors, inspectors and financiers).

The facility owner/manager starts the process by applying to participate in the pilot. Successful approvals will receive low-cost, custom information, guidance and other support through the entire process.

Following completion of the building upgrade, an EE Check certificate will be awarded to the facility owner/manager.

All energy savings from participating facilities will be monitored by the *Energy Action Team* and an evaluation of the pilot program will be completed.
